



# Key messages - GPs

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- Our patients prefer to have investigations if they have potential cancer symptoms



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- SYMPTOM studies tell us the real importance of safety netting and allowing for evolution of potential cancer symptoms



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- Risk Assessment Tools are a valuable asset and benefit patients
- Important contribution to updated NICE guidelines, which will change the way in which we work, and in which patients are diagnosed



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- Change in diagnostic pathways can and will happen – but there is a huge battle to win some hearts and minds



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- Most importantly – this programme has raised the profile of cancer diagnostics in UK primary care. GPs now think about cancer more. It is part of a quiet revolution that will contribute to better cancer outcomes
